About ACCOLEDS

ACCOLEDS is a committee of COPPUL, the Council of Prairie and Pacific University Libraries. ACCOLEDS was founded in 1992, and stands for "A COPPUL Consortium of Library Electronic Data Services."

The ACCOLEDS [membership](#) consists of representatives from academic libraries in Western Canada which are members of Statistics Canada's Data Liberation Initiative (DLI).

The DLI provides three days of training for its ACCOLEDS members each year, usually in the first or second week of December. It subsidizes the travel costs for each institution's DLI contact person (who is usually a data librarian) in order to ensure that the training is accessible to all members.

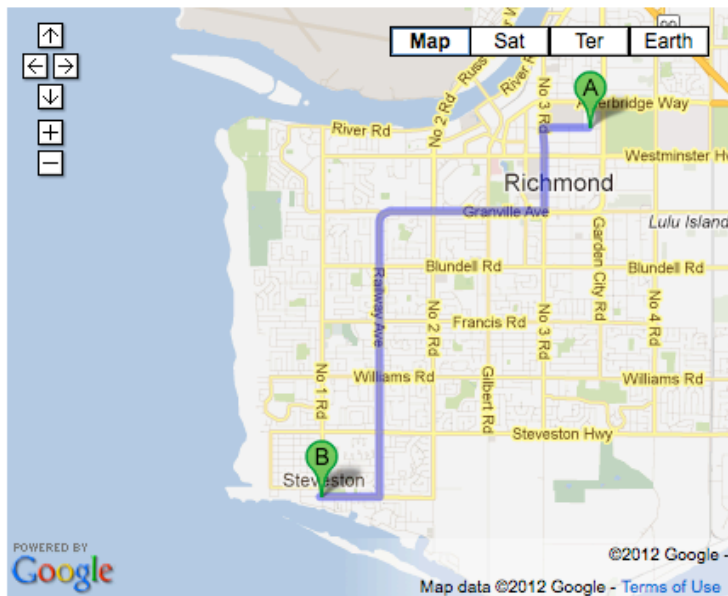

Richmond is home to one of Kwantlen Polytechnic University's four campuses. The vicinity around the campus offers numerous shops, services and recreational venues. The [Richmond city website](#) provides an [overview](#) of the city including [parks and recreation](#).

General Services

There are 2 enclosed shopping malls close to Kwantlen that will provide access to many food options, services and stores. [Lansdowne Centre](#) Mall is right across the street from Kwantlen. A larger mall, [Richmond Centre](#), is within walking distance or just one stop via the Canada Line (although by the time you walk the Canada Line Lansdowne station you are half-way to the mall already!).

Another shopping area is along Ackroyd Avenue (5 minute walk) with grocery stores and restaurants on both sides of the street. Shops on the north side of the street include Chapters with Starbucks coffee, [bank], and restaurants. Crossing over to the south side of the street among the shops you'll find a Save-on-Foods, Liquor Store, and eateries including Boston Pizza and White Spot.

For recreation, Minoru Park provides access to the Richmond Cultural Centre which is home to the Richmond Public Library, Aquatic Center, Ice rink, outdoor walking track, public gardens, Minoru Chapel and the Gateway Theatre. Minoru Park is within walking distance (across from Richmond Centre). The Dyke surrounding Richmond is popular for walking. You can walk along the dyke to the Richmond Olympic oval passing public art and lovely views of the river separating Richmond from Vancouver.

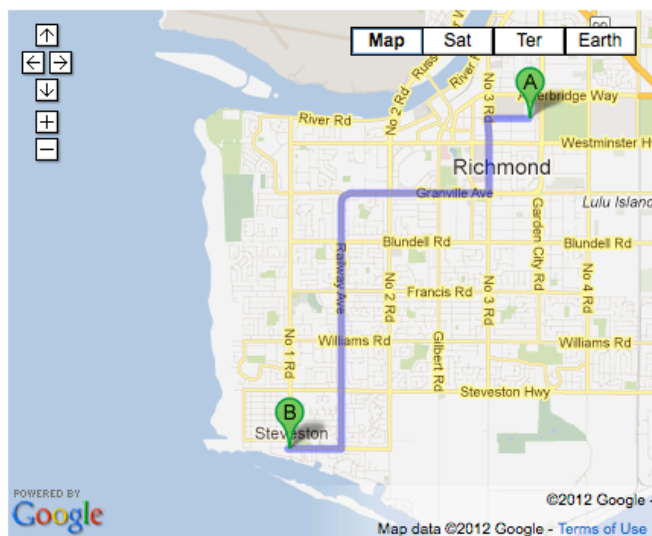
